STATE EXAMINATION ARRANGEMENTS


Please find enclosed a copy of the Junior Certificate Examinations Timetable 2019. The State Examinations Commission has a results service available on-line to the Junior Certificate. Directions as to how to use this service along with a PIN number to access results will follow.

Your attention is also drawn to the following arrangements:

1. Junior Certificate pupils are expected to attend school up to the 31 May.
2. **The school will be open from 10.00a.m. on Tuesday June 4th and all boarders should return for Prep before 6.30p.m. that evening.** A list of those wishing to have lunch and tea will be compiled prior to the June Bank holiday.
3. Candidates must present themselves in the examination hall (Sports Complex) at least **half an hour** before their first examination is scheduled to start. They should arrive **at least ten minutes** before each subsequent examination.
4. The examination superintendents will explain the State Examinations Commission regulations in detail on the first day of examinations. These have to be followed exactly.
5. It is vital to have the correct material for each examination and to have a copy of your examination number.
6. There is a set time period for each examination paper. This is the amount of time required to complete the paper properly. **We strongly urge all candidates to remain in the examination hall for the full duration of each paper. Leaving before the due time (a) obviously damages the candidate's own performance and (b) disturbs and unsettles other candidates. Any pupil who leaves early will have his/her name logged with the time of leaving and be brought to the Library for supervised revision study.**
7. **During the examination period normal school rules will naturally apply and school uniform is to be worn.** Leave-out must be sought in the usual way and boarders must sign in and out at times relevant to them.
8. Under State Examinations Commission guidelines, **students who cause serious disruption can be required to find an alternative examination centre.**
9. **Mobile telephones, or other electronic devices not specified as permitted by the authorities must NEVER be taken to the examination hall. Breach of this rule or any form of deceit involving notes or copying, will result in the entire examination being declared null and void and could lead to criminal proceedings.**
10. Pupils with a special examination centre will meet with their supervisor the week before the examinations and the procedures will be carefully explained. They must also attend the base examination centres in the Sports Complex with all other candidates at 9.00a.m. on the first morning.

Candidates have prepared for three years for these examinations at considerable cost and effort. We wish every student the very best of good fortune in the certificate examinations.
